Superfast Broadband - News from community group The Broadband User Group (BUG) is up and running, with representatives from Ampleforth, Oswaldkirk, Gilling, Wass and smaller villages in the area, as we are not sure about the range of the service we will receive. NYCC is managing the provision of the rural broadband services and aims to have North Yorkshire fully connected by 2017. NYCC intends to set up a closed list of 8-10 ISPs for the entire County.

Villages will be clustered together around the technical feasibility of using the same connection service and a provider will be chosen from the list. The aim is to start with one cluster per District Council and we have to bid against other groups of villages to go first in Ryedale. Preparation is in hand and we will know if we are successful by June or July. If not, we will have to wait until a later date. The parish council would like one more councillor to represent Ampleforth and to help with the workload. The council has to petition the electorate of Ampleforth Parish and the petition will be available to sign at the Annual Parish Meeting.

Ampleforth Parish Council's Budget for 2012-2013

The budget was discussed and agreed at the council's December meeting and a precept of $\pounds 16,500$ was agreed.

The main sources of income are the precept, about £200 for common share rents, burial fees, a grant from the North York Moors National Park Authority towards the upkeep of the village and funding from NYCC towards cutting the verges.

The main expenses are general village maintenance – cutting the verges, the Millennium Green and St Hilda's Churchyard and the cemetery, looking after the Millennium Green and the trees along the main street, keeping the stream and the horse trough clear, streetlighting energy and repairs, insurance, administration (website, travel expenses, clerk's salary, training, village hall rent etc.), subscriptions, snow clearance, a contingency budget and grants. In 2011-2012 the council made the following grants. RDC Chairman's Charities £50 Citizens Advice Bureau £150 St Benedict's Church £250 Ampleforth Playing Field £650
